The legislative power of the City, except as reserved to the people by this Charter, by means of the initiative and referendum, shall be vested in a council, elected by wards, one from each ward, and for a maximum of two (2) complete consecutive terms of four (4) years each. A Councilperson will be eligible for election after an intervening term. A Councilperson shall be an elector of the ward from which the Councilperson is elected and of not less than twenty-one years of age.</p> <p>Section 83. The City Council of Youngstown shall, not later than 120 days after certification of the results of the decennial U.S. Census, redistrict the City into wards based on the City's population using official U.S. Census statistics.
